

Seoul

Multicultural Children's Library Modoo

Located in Dongdaemun District, Seoul, this library not only offers a diverse collection of books but also hosts an annual multicultural village festival.



Gyeonggi

Rainbow Multicultural Local Library

Officially recognized by Seongnam City in Gyeonggi Province, the Rainbow Multicultural Local Library boasts a collection of over 10,000 volumes.



Gyeonggi

Ansan Multicultural Local Library

Located in Ansan City, Gyeonggi Province, this library offers monthly programs that include reading and hands-on creative activities.



Gangwon

Wonju City Central Library

Located in Wonju City, Gangwon Province, it features a dedicated multicultural resources section on the third floor.



Daegu

Dalseo Multicultural Family Local Library
