Step 1. Determine your target university and major



From a young age, I loved computers and dreamt of becoming a software developer. **I looked into which universities would be suitable for the majors I was interested in.** After being inspired by a software department professor on a TV program, I even considered the university where the professor taught.

Tip: Check the current status of your child

Review your child's academic performance after entering high school. Check the average grade and compare the academic information of schools based on the current grades. Each school has different rolling admission methods, so start with a broad range and narrow down. **Set a target of 10 to 15 universities, considering various options based on your child's performance: upward, appropriate, and downward.**



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Step 2. Diligently prepare the Activity Record



I wanted to major in electronic engineering and set my goal to become an AI semiconductor researcher, so I diligently prepared my activity record. **I wrote a self-assessment letter for related subjects, highlighting my intellectual curiosity, motivation, and abilities.** I considered career relevance and created an after-action report to showcase my achievements at a glance. I also utilized my experience studying Python for integrative thinking.

Tip: The Activity Record needs management!

With the elimination of personal essays and no more reflection on reading, awards, and individual volunteer activities for admissions, the activity record has become crucial. How to manage it? Teachers base it on the self-assessment letters written by students, meaning **students can actively contribute to its creation!**

Step 3. It's not over until it's over! Minimum Required Score for the College Scholastic Ability Test



My academic performance wasn't strong, so I prepared for the essay exam with a minimum required score. Wanting to become a profiler, I aimed to major in psychology and **verified the minimum educational requirements for my desired major.** To meet the combined grade point requirement of 3 subjects within 5 grade points, I focused on studying Korean and English, the subjects I was confident in.

Tip: The essay exam is quite strategic!

Many avoid the essay exam due to the difficulty of accessing information. However, the percentage of students meeting the minimum educational requirements is not high, so the competition is not too intense. **If you meet the minimum requirements, the essay exam can be a great opportunity and strategy!**
